Friends,

As we approach the twentieth anniversary, we are grateful that despite challenges, we have been able to carry out our mission and reach out to children and youth in underserved areas, bringing to their lives opportunities for education and for obtaining relevant skills which will empower them to meet their aspirations. With the advent of technology and all pervasive social media, the children even in the remote rural areas are moving away from the traditional livelihood options of the earlier generation and aspiring for new age careers in the field of technology development, entertainment and media. Traditional lure of government jobs however retains its hold, as they are perceived as jobs with high security, good remuneration and low accountability.

Sshrishti has been consistently offering remedial education at all levels of school education to improve learning outcome and prevent the children from dropping out of the schooling system to join the labour force. We have been largely successful in our efforts, as students under our tutelage have successfully passed their board examinations and have either gone ahead for higher studies or have joined our skill development programme.

It is easy to see their enthusiasm in acquiring digital skills. In Uttarakhand, we often see children and youth walking long distances over mountainous tracks to avail of the computer based courses offered at Sshrishti's centres of project Community Resource Network.

I take this opportunity for thanking all of you for your support and encouragement, and team Sshrishti for their committed service.

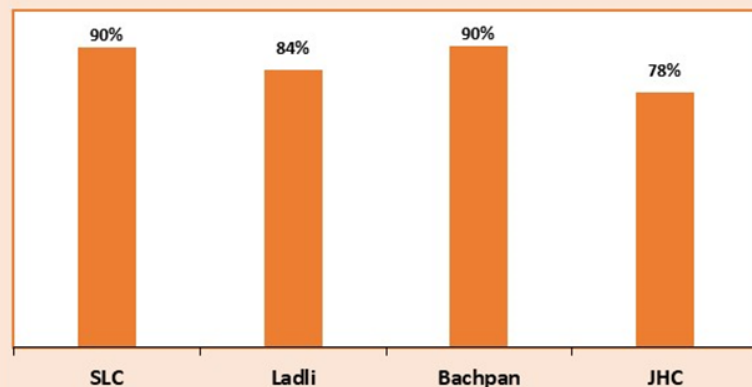

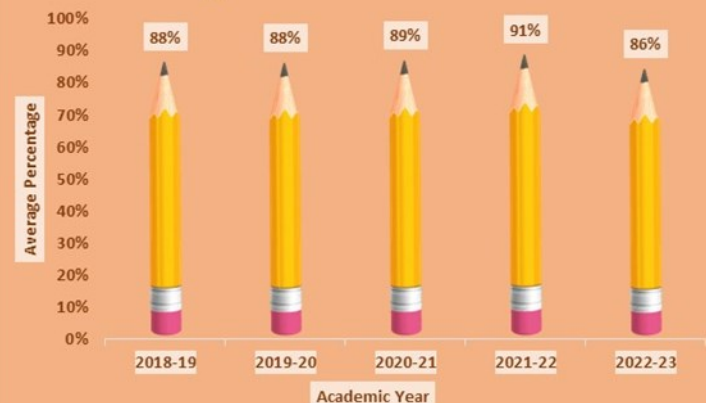


Educational Impact in 2022-23 of Educational Centres in Delhi

Digital Literacy for the last mile

Only 21% of rural children have access to computer literacy in India, when the developed economies are racing to implement artificial intelligence. It is imperative for the 21st century workforce to have expertise in computer applications.

This is a situation that needs urgent action and we have been committed to this programme since 2008 through our Rural Digital Literacy programme, which was launched in a remote village named Surana in Rajasthan. It has been a continuous journey across four states in North India making more than 15,000 children computer literate.

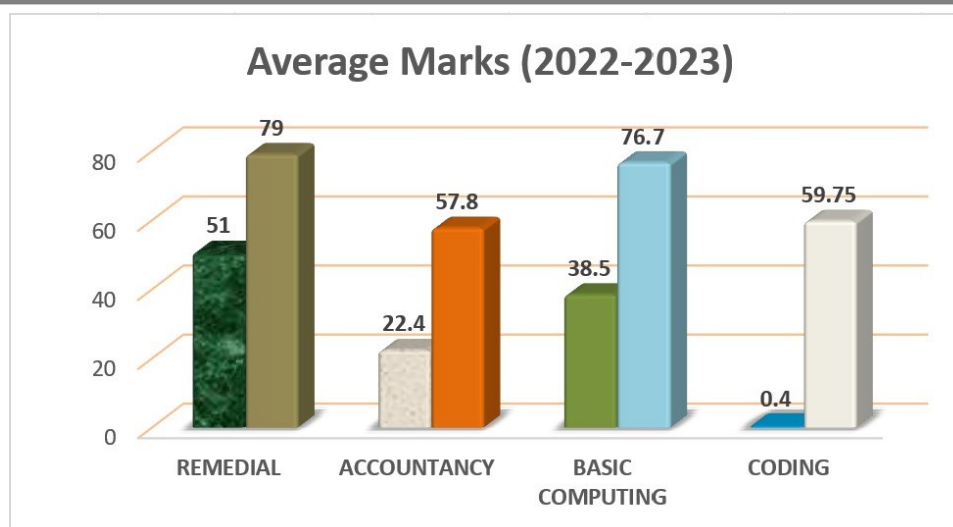

Project Digital Leap, Uttarakhand

This project promotes Digital Literacy in the State of Uttarakhand by bringing computer literacy to **18 government schools in the Nainital and Almora districts**. The project currently covers thirteen government schools and five prisons in the state. The school students in remote mountainous regions are kept out of the digital world because a lack of computers and trained teachers. Sshrishti's teachers are bridging the gap by taking classes daily and making the children not only computer literate but also engaging them in activities to improve their communication and interpersonal skills.



District Jail, Dehradun

The **inmates of prisons** who have been locked up for years and out of contact with the outside world. For them computer literacy is like a breath of the free world outside their prison cells and connecting with the changing world of technology. It gives them hope and equips them for a career or to pursue higher education once they are outside the prison.

Case Study of Ruby



The five most deserving young women from socioeconomically low-income families with good academic records were supported for their higher education by Amba Dalmia Scholarship.

Daughter of daily wage labourers living in a slum in Vasant Kunj, she had started her education at Sshrishti. She had to drop out of school because her parents married her when she was in class IX. Now she wants to continue her education. We have enrolled her in the Open School for her grade X examination through NIOS, paid the fees, and provided her with books.

Now, Ruby is qualified and has started a job enabling her to support her family financially. We are proud of her success and wish her the very best for the future.

Smiles abound as students receive new tablets - Digital Shakti Project

Project Digital Shakti, District Almora, Uttarakhand, 2022 - 23



This is a research project to understand how school children use technology to access learning without any prompting and with prompting. Tablets with preloaded quality educational software by Byjus and Mind Spark were distributed to 700 students of class IV and Class VIII along with internet recharge. The children were shown how to access the learning material and were encouraged to use the tablets for a couple of hours a week. The usage data of each child was monitored, and IIM Ahmedabad is analysing the data to take out a research paper. This will help in rolling out ed-tech at scale across government schools.

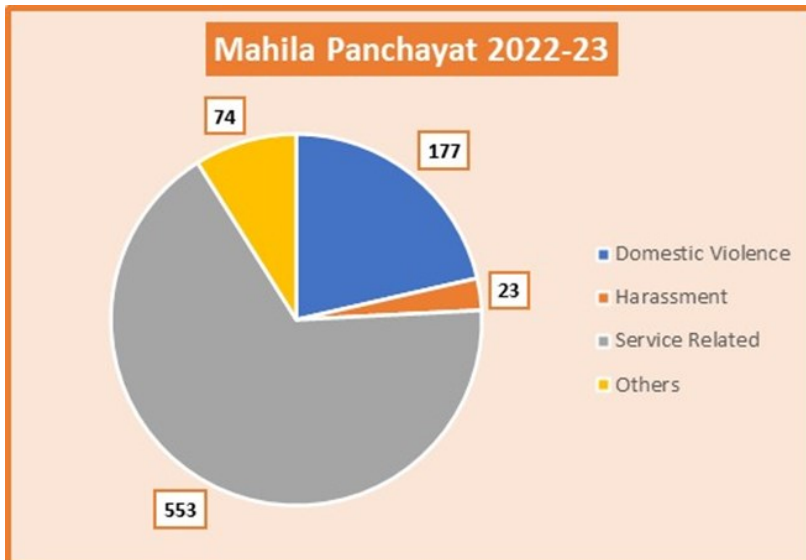
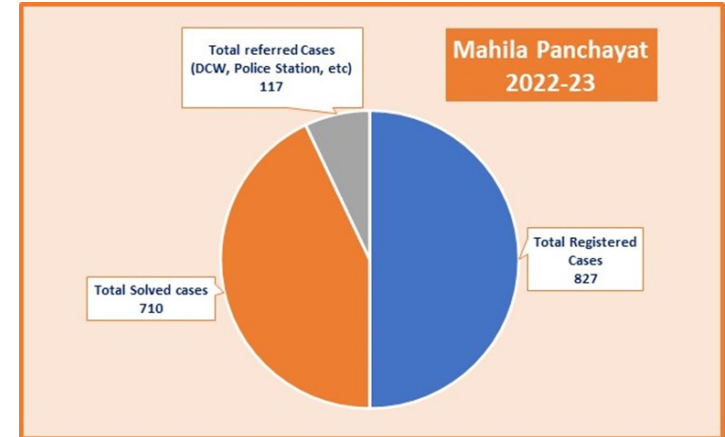
Empowering Women

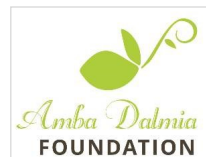
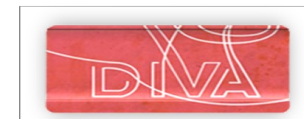
