From the CEO's Desk



Dear Friends,

Its been a long journey of 21 years, of some successes and challenges which sometimes seemed to overpower. But no one said it would be an easy journey! The resolve to bring about a change continues to drive team Sshrishti forward.

Our programme in Uttarakhand has increased its reach by starting a programme in Dist. Rudraprayg. In six villages in the Agastyamuni block near the confluence of the mighty rivers Mandakini and Bhagirathi, Sshrishti implemented digital literacy programme in four government schools. This was a big boon for the students of these schools which suffered from ramshackle computer labs with no functional systems or teachers. Sshrishti's team repaired the computer labs, installed desktops and appointed a teacher to guide the students with a structured curriculum.

Carrying forward the school improvement programme, Sshrishti's team carried out several infrastructural development in the selected schools. We thank Renew Power for supporting this initiative.

Our programmes in Nainital and Almora districts of Uttarakhand continued to grow in strength bring hope to the youth with digital skilling for employability. Many have got suitable employment and some have gone on to become entrepreneurs. We thank KPMG for supporting the project for over a decade.

Our programmes in Delhi NCR has not grown in the last year primarily due to lack of resources. It is time the donor community become cognizant of the fact that other than the programmatic support, NGOs need resources for the growth of the organisation. The team which works tirelessly to improve the lives of others are not remunerated enough to meet their basic aspirations. So, unavailability of skilled resources remain a grave challenge to the sustainability of the organisation.

But at the end of the day its in the smiles of children and sparkle in the eyes of the youth and women with who we work give us the motivation to take forward our mission to **Educate, Empower and Equalise.**

Community Resource Network, Sshrishti's flagship programme in Uttarakhand

The project provides digital literacy to 18 government schools in Nainital and Almora districts. The schools are typically in remote mountainous villages. The children of these villages have no access to digital literacy and the project provides digital inclusion for these underserved communities.

The youth of these areas are provided digital skilling for employability through skilling centres. The details are as follows:

1. Vill Letibunga Dist. Nainital—200 students
2. Bhowali, Dist Nainital—200 students
3. Someshwar Dist Almora—200 students

These Centres provide training in basic computer literacy with—

- Data Science with Python
- Tally with Accountancy Package
- Graphic Designing & Video Editing
- BPO training
- Career counselling
- Placement drives

Total of 3785 students were impacted by the programme in 2024—2025. Out of these 3187 were government school students.

Impact digital literacy: 35% at joining to 85% at the end of the training. STEM (remedial) 45% to 80 % in a year's time. 88 students were placed in suitable jobs.

Foundational literacy and numeracy (FLN)

Since 2003 Sshrishti has been focussed on equipping the children of low income colonies of Dehi, especially the children of migrant workers with quality FLN to create a solid foundation for their educational journey. The curriculum is upgraded each year and it follows the broad guidelines of NEP 2020.

The Diksha app of NCERT has been incorporated in the curriculum to give the student an opportunity to use interactive online learning.

The students who join our centres in Nursery are mainstreamed into government or private schools after completing class V at our Sshrishti learning Centre

National Initiative for Reading with Understanding and Numeracy '21

In its quest to provide the best possible methodology for the young learners, Sshrishti follows the guidelines of Nipun Bharat to ensure that the students learn to read with understanding and develop gross and fine motor skills. The concepts of numbers are gradually introduced to them to allow them to have conceptual clarity. Teachers are guided to read aloud stories allowing children to have free flowing discussion about the story, the characters and the activities. Assessments of learning gaps in children are done through class observations. Special emphasis is given on socio emotional learning of the students to ensure their holistic development. The students are encouraged to solve problems and learn by doing and experiencing.

FLN - In 2024—25 a total of 631 students received quality foundational literacy and numeracy along with opportunities for various extra curricular activities to ensure their holistic development. All students are members of the designated clubs based on their aptitude and interest. The clubs promoting their extracurricular activities are at all the learning centres and they are as follows:



Brain Booster Club—Puzzles, quizzes, activities to promote logical thinking.



Drama Club— promoting self expression and communication



Power Pack Club—building strength with physical activities.



Multi tasker Club— caring for environment and promoting art and craft



Discover Club—Promoting STEM related activities.

In order to improve the lives of the villages in these remote mountainous regions which suffer poor infrastructure. In the first phase of the project computer labs in four schools were repaired and the labs set up with a teacher to guide the students in their journey to access digital literacy. In the second phase, the project has successfully completed building classrooms and toilets in schools along with a large shed for mid day meal. The project also undertook building pathways leading to the schools. to make access easier for the students and the teachers.

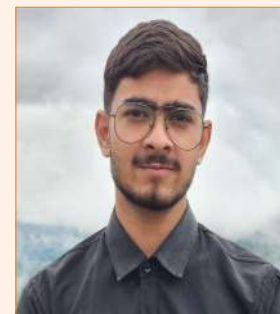

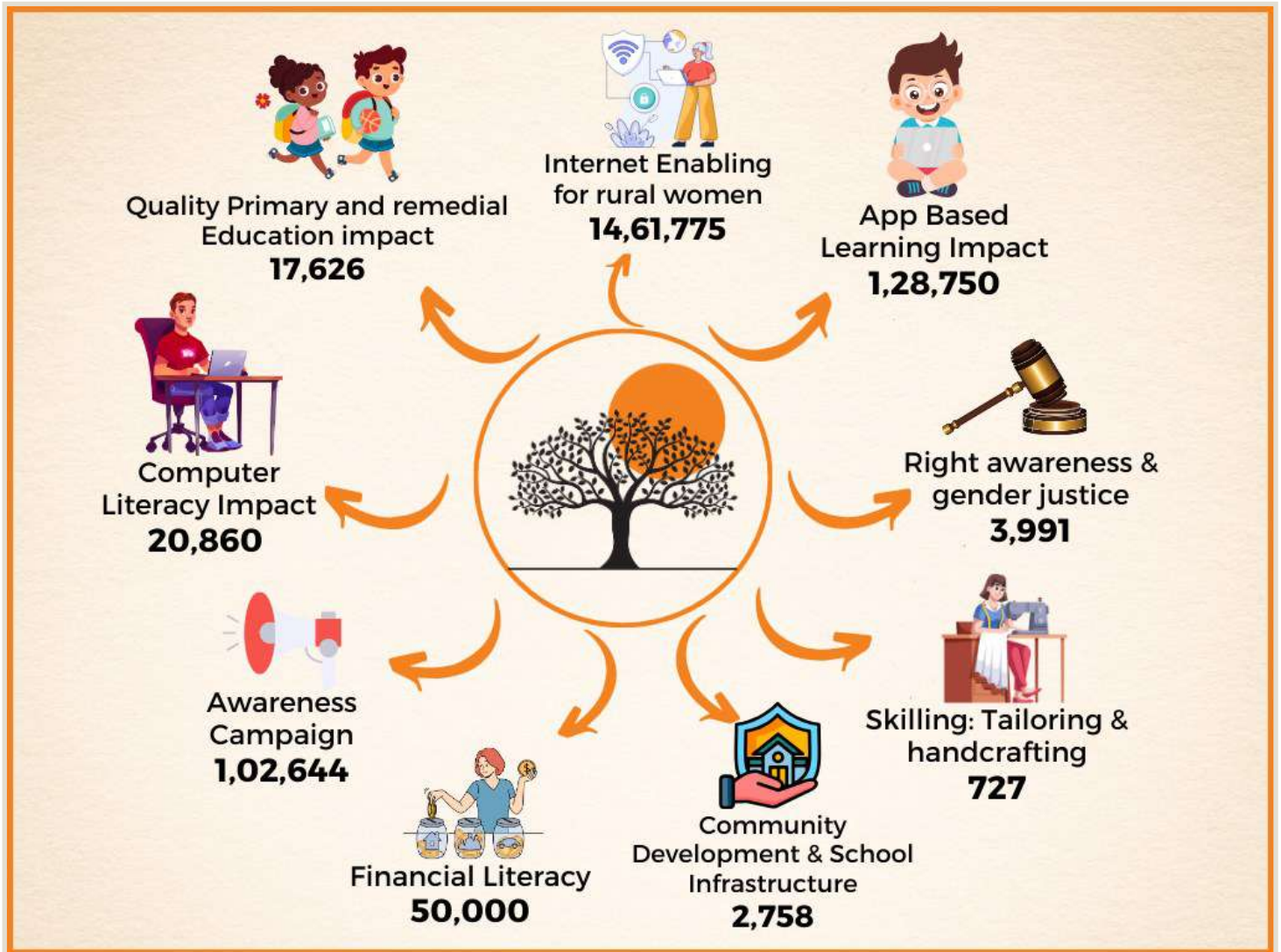

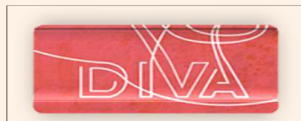

Independent Auditor's Report

Report on the Financial Statements

Sharad – A Young Dreamer with Resilience



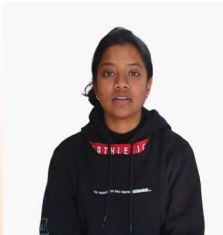
Sharad, a 6-year-old student of Class 1st B at SLC Junior Centre, embodies quiet strength and determination. Living with his parents and siblings in a small, rented room in Kishangarh, New Delhi, Sharad's family faces financial challenges. His father works as a driver, and his mother is a homemaker. Despite limited means, they remain deeply committed to their children's education and ensure Sharad attends school regularly.
